O'Rese Knight, MD, Assistant Professor of Ophthalmology and glaucoma specialist at the University of North Carolina Kittner Eye Center. He has research interests in 24 hour intraocular pressure measurement and clinical device design. His work has received funding for the National Eye Institute, the American Glaucoma Society, and the University of North Carolina. He is a prior Rabb - Venable Research Competition participant and owes much of his professional success to mentors he developed relationships with through the NMA Ophthalmology Section. Beyond ophthalmology he serves on national committees concerned with increasing physician workforce diversity and physician licensure.

Dolly Padovani-Claudio, MD, PhD, is an Assistant Professor of Ophthalmology and Visual Sciences at Vanderbilt University Medical Center. She is a board-certified ophthalmologist and member of the American Academy of Ophthalmology and the American Association for Pediatric Ophthalmology and Strabismus. She practices at the Tennessee Lions Eye Center at the Vanderbilt Eye Institute. Her laboratory is focused on finding new treatments for angiogenic retinopathies such as diabetic retinopathy and retinopathy of prematurity. Due to the growing incidence of obesity and diabetes in the pediatric population, and advances in neonatal care, an increase in the prevalence of complications associated with these conditions is expected.

Her research centers on understanding processes at the intersection of inflammation and vascular growth in the retina, and on repurposing existing drugs developed to target these processes in non-ocular systems to prevent, abort or revert them in angiogenic retinopathies. She hopes that repurposing such drugs will bypass the costly, lengthy, and risky drug development process and accelerate the translation of her research to effective therapies for patients with blinding conditions.
